

## APPENDIX I

### ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR APPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION FOR THE POST OF SUB-INSPECTOR IN SIKKIM POLICE:

In order to be eligible a candidate must possess the following minimum physical, age and educational qualifications:

I. PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS			MALE	FEMALE
(a)	Height	-	5' 3" (Minimum)	5' (Minimum)
(b)	Chest	-	32" (Minimum) with minimum expansion of 02"	N.A.
(c)	Weight	-	50kgs (Minimum)	45kgs (Minimum)

### II. EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND OTHER CONDITIONS.

- a) Minimum Educational Qualification: Degree from a recognized University.
- b) Age: Should have attained the age of 18 years and should not exceed 25 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> day of the month following the date on which the advertisement for recruitment is published.  
In case of Police Departmental candidates under Government of Sikkim in regular establishment, the maximum age is relaxed up to 45 Years as on 1<sup>ST</sup> day of the month following the advertisement as per Not No.227/GEN/DOP dtd: 27.09.2013
- c) Other Qualifications
- 1) should be conversant with the customs and usages of Sikkim.
  - 2) Should have knowledge of any of the State language viz. Nepali, Sikkimese Bhutia, Lepcha and Limboo.
  - 3) Should have valid local Employment Card.

SCHEME & SYLLABUS

The competitive examination comprises of 03 successive stages

**1<sup>st</sup> Stage:** Preliminary Examination (Objective type) as a screening test (2 papers)

This examination is meant to serve as a screening test only: **the marks obtained in the Preliminary examination by the candidate who is declared qualified for admission to the Main Examination will not be counted for determining his final order of merit.** The number of candidates to be called for the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) from amongst those qualifying the Preliminary Examination shall be determined by the Sikkim Public Service Commission at its discretion. Only those candidates who are declared by the Commission to have qualified in the preliminary examination and Physical Efficiency cum Physical Endurance Test will be eligible for admission to the main examination.

Syllabus for preliminary examination

I. General Studies - (150 marks/02 hrs)

1. Current Events of State, National & International importance
2. History of India and Indian National Movement
3. Indian Polity and Governance
4. Economic and Social Developments
5. General aspect of Law order and internal security
6. Basics of computer science
7. General Science (Class X level).
8. General English (Class X level).

II. Reasoning, Aptitude and Mental Ability - (150 marks/02 hrs)

1. Logical reasoning and analytical ability
2. Decision-making and problem solving
3. General mental ability
4. Basic Maths (Class X level)
5. Basic Statistics

Note: The Preliminary Examination shall consist of two papers of 150 marks each. The time limit for each paper shall be of two hours duration. The question will be of multiple choice/objective type.

**2nd Stage: PHYSICAL EFFICIENCY TEST****-50 MARKS**

Candidates appearing in the PET will have to qualify in each of the following five events. Failure to qualify in any one of the events would mean their disqualification for the post of Sub-Inspector.

The standards of Physical Efficiency Test prescribed for Sub-Inspectors are as follows: -

**(a) 100- Meter Race**

The time taken from start to finish is noted by means of a stop watch and recorded. Candidates will have only one chance at the event.

**(b) 1500- Meter Race**

The time taken from start to finish is noted by means of a stop watch and recorded. Candidates will have only one chance at the event.

**(c) High Jump (maximum three chances at the qualifying level and one chance at each subsequent level)**

The cross bar is placed at the minimum height. Those who qualify in three or less attempts will be allowed one attempt at the next level. Those who qualify this level will be allowed one attempt at the last level. Candidates are placed in the level A, B or C as per their best jump and given marks accordingly.

**(d) Long Jump (three chances)**

Three lines are marked at the three distances indicated above from the front edge of the take off point. Each candidate will have three jumps and will be placed in level A, B or C as per his/her best jump and marks awarded accordingly. If while jumping a candidate touches the ground beyond the front edge of the take off point it will be treated as a foul. Whether fair or foul, only three jumps will be allowed.

**(e) Shot-Put (three chances)**

A circle 7 ft in diameter will be drawn. Two lines at 30° and 60° will be drawn to form the sector in which the shot is to be thrown. Three arcs will then be drawn in this sector at distances stated above from the front edge of the circle. Each candidate will have three chances with 16 lb weight for male and 12 lb weight for female and his/her best performance level A, B or C will be recorded and marks awarded accordingly. If while throwing a candidate touches the ground in front of circle it will be treated as a foul. Whether fair or foul, only three chances will be allowed.

**Instructions for the candidates.**

- (1) The standards and contents of papers in general shall be similar to those of Bachelor's Degree Level Examination of recognized Indian University.
- (2) A candidate shall answer the papers in English only.
- (3) Only those candidates who are declared qualified in the Preliminary Examination and Physical Efficiency cum Physical Endurance Test will be eligible for admission to the Main Examination.
- (4) Marks obtained by the candidates in the PET and Mains Examination (Written) would determine the final ranking.

The Total Marks of stage II & III is

- 550 Marks
