In China the red banner with large white characters had been the standard channel of communicating governmental directives and concerns to citizens ever since the communists came to power more than half a century ago. In turn citizens themselves used these banners to flag their collective commitment and support for government policy. Collective aspirations, collective commitment, the very thoughts of people were assumed and expressed as collective through these red banners.

So powerful was their presence that they seeped into metaphor. Only a few decades ago citizens were regularly urged to 'raise high the red banner of Mao Zedong thought'. Red was a potent colour in China- traditionally the colour for good luck and celebration and in more modern times the hue of revolution.

The hutongs, in many ways the last bastion of the collective culture of communism, were filled with the gnomic utterances of large- white -character - on -red-backdrop-banners. Three issues loomed larger than others on the banners that dotted my neighbourhood: the Olympic Games, care for the elderly, and dogs.

'Abide by the Dog Rules', one large banner cryptically announced, stretched out between two sturdy trees, only a few metres down from my courtyard. Next to it another urged residents to "Visit the elderly; bring happiness to them".

The hutongs were disproportionately peopled with retirees and their pets; the ever-dwindling younger generation having taken off for swankier addresses. China's experiment with demographic engineering through its one-child policy had created one of the fastest ageing populations the world had ever seen. 'The Middle Kingdom goes from Red to Grey', the headline of one media report catchily summed up, a summation that a quick walk around the hutongs was enough to confirm.

Why are there so many kinds of workers in today's cities and towns? Why doesn't every one of us make the things he wants for himself as people did a long time ago? Primitive man did just that. He built his own hut, grew his own food, made his own clothing and furnished his little hut with what little he wanted. And he was satisfied; he did not have to depend on anyone for food – or for any other essentials. He was his own master.

But as his wants grew and more and more people started to live together, they discovered the advantage of the division of labour. Since practice makes one perfect, doing the same thing again and again leads to greater speed and efficiency. So today different people are doing different things and no one tries to specialize in too many things.

A result of this division of labour is that in our world we now have specialists in all sorts of things. In the U.S.A young people graduate in dish washing, flower arrangement, interior decoration, hair dressing and so on. An inevitable result is that people know more and more about less and less and work only in their own narrow fields of specialization.

There are a number of advantages of such a division of labour but there are at least two disadvantages also. One, people do not take interest in each other's work; they are narrow specialists. Secondly, the worker does not get the satisfaction that comes from producing a thing (eg. a bicycle or a pen); each worker produces a small part of the thing and no one is its maker. (276 words)
